Saturday 1st July


The Standing Committee for the Agreement Sectors invites all members working at institutions covered by the AIIC agreements to join them for the first ever Intersectoral Meeting.

On March 2nd, Catriona Howard will be speaking at the PA Show in London, on the value of multilingualism at international events.









ATPD



The ATPD held its first inperson annual meeting since
the outbreak of the Covid-19
pandemic; in fact, it was the
first in-person meeting to be
held since Michelle Hof took
over as coordinator in
September 2020, and her base
in Tenerife turned out to be the
perfect location!

Attending in person were ATPD Coordinator Michelle Hof and full members Anna Niang, Tzewei Chen, Gillian Misener, and Denise de Vasconcelos Araujo. Full member Stefano Marrone and corresponding member Hilda Tejada attended remotely.

Two full days (January 21-22) were devoted to deliberations to address ATPD business. Highlights included a discussion with VP Haris Ghinos about AIIC's plans for setting up a Foundation, and an exchange of views with Communications Officer Claire Wood about the Schools Directory.

Other sessions addressed matters such as sharing training-related news from the regions, mapping out future ATPD training events, plans for ATPD's contribution to the AIIC@70 celebrations, liaison between ATPD and other AIIC bodies and groups, developing a members' survey on training needs, and reviewing and updating the Schools Directory.

One session was dedicated to "blue-sky" thinking on new training formats, fostering networking amongst trainers, promoting cooperation between ATPD and other AIIC bodies, and building bridges throughout the conference interpreting training community.

ATPD members also took the opportunity to visit one of the interpreting programmes listed in <u>AIIC's Schools Directory</u>. Michelle was kind enough to organise a tour of the training facilities of the University of La Laguna's EMCI program, where the visiting trainers were able to observe and participate in interpreting classes and meet with the programme directors.

Members felt that the in-person format allowed for much more work to get done, as they were able to interact not only on the meeting floor but also on the sidelines and during informal contacts before and after the meeting sessions. All agreed that sharing a physical space with a group of like-minded colleagues contributed much more to team-building efforts than any number of virtual meetings ever could.

In sum, ATPD members used this meeting as an opportunity to reinstate their full commitment to organizing Training of Trainers courses and promoting CPD training initiatives for conference interpreters, both in person in different AIIC regions. as well as online. The group is looking forward to the next in-person meeting in Brussels during the anniversary celebrations in June.

NEWS FROM EXCO

RESEARCH FUNDING

At the 2022 Assembly in Geneva, AIIC members <u>called for the Association to provide</u> <u>greater financial support for research</u> into the possible negative effects of distance interpreting on our health and well-being.

ExCo is therefore pleased to announce that AIIC will be co-funding a clinical study into the potential consequences of digitally manipulated sound on the human auditory system.

In line with the Assembly's decision, we will be supporting the research of a multidisciplinary team of researchers. In this, AIIC will join other reputable institutions working in the fields of audiology, electroacoustics, sound engineering, health insurance and medical research, who will all benefit from a greater understanding of the potential risks digitally manipulated sound could have on our hearing.

Members will be kept up to date with the results of the research as they become available.



NEWS FROM HQ

Just over a year ago, ExCo announced **8 Strategic Goals** for their triennium, the first of which is about to come to fruition.

Goal #5: Operational Coverage of the Secretariat, coordinated by Executive Secretary Claude-Alain Battiaz, involved researching how the Secretariat could grow and take on more work in line with the AIIC4000 goals, without resulting in an increase of membership dues.

To cover more time zones than can be done from Geneva and to reflect the international nature of the Association, it was decided that AIIC should open an office outside Europe.

After careful consideration of the various regions, Asia Pacific was chosen for various reasons. Among them, the size of the membership, the technically skilled local workforce, a similar professional mindset to that of Switzerland and good transport connections with Geneva. From a shortlist of 7 cities, Bangkok was finally selected as the most suitable location for the new AIIC office.

The new office will work closely in tandem with the Geneva office, allowing more enquiries to be dealt with in real time and thereby reducing the time members have to wait to receive support.



Having staff in Bangkok on local contracts, will also allow the Secretariat to increase its staff and workload without a corresponding increase in membership dues.

The search is now on for the first member of staff in Bangkok, with the intention of taking on a second staff member by early 2024 when AIIC succeeds in increasing the number of members over the coming year.

CALL FOR VOLUNTEERS

AIIC is in the process of revamping its public website and we are looking for volunteers to take responsibility for at least 1 page of content.

Translators

We are looking for native French speakers willing to translate the content of at least a single web page from English into French.

Most of the new web pages are around 500 words (the longest is 700) and cover topics that are of interest to non-members such as what AIIC does, the sectors, training, research, and membership.

Some of the pages are ready to be translated now, others will be ready in the coming months.

Commitment: Translate 1 page or more from English to French

Timeline: March to May

Proofreaders/Revisers

We need English and French native speakers to proofread the finished pages and to make sure that there is a consistent voice across the pages.

Commitment: This will be an ongoing task from March to June as pages become available.

There will be a total of around 30 pages on the public website, including the basic texts which have already been translated.
