The AIIC Executive Committee was saddened to learn about a recent acoustic incident in which two colleagues from the Canada Region sustained acoustic shock injuries while working at a conference with a remote presenter. We wish them both a quick and complete recovery. This event underscores the need for technical quality standards and protective measures – such as compressor limiters and hearing protection devices.

We are pleased that on 5 December a former conference interpreter was elected to the 7-person Swiss Federal Council, the executive branch of the Federal Government. Karin Keller-Sutter is an alumnus of the Institute of Translation and Interpreting at Zurich University of Applied Sciences. Africa Region Report: A mosAIIC of minds in Kigali

On 27 October, interpreters from across the continent gathered in

Kigali, Rwanda, for the 2018 AIIC Africa Regional Meeting. Advisory Board member Sylvia Amisi opened the event, noting the timeliness of the occasion, with the ongoing UNCEB-AIIC negotiations for a new agreement, and the dizzying pace of tech innovation in the profession. AIIC Vice President Emmanuel Ayuk gave opening remarks, informing members that AIIC is currently working on draft minimum standards for remote interpreting. The agenda



covered: branding and visibility for the region – including an AIIC.AFRICA regional website; demands for professional development; updates from professional delegations; considerations

for the future of the profession; and a presentation on remote interpretation (delivered remotely, appropriately!).
