



Record-breaking PRIMS turnout in London

The AIIC Private Market Sector (PRIMS) Interregional Meeting kickstarted the year for more than 170 interpreters who congregated in London on the weekend of 12–13 January. Additionally, 120+ members from around the world participated via webstreaming on the Saturday. The meeting included: a discussion of Brexit – its history, likely effects, and the implications for the UK and surrounding regions; AIIC regional market reports – from the UK, Ireland, Belgium, France, and the Netherlands; as well as presentations by the Consultant Interpreters Standing Committee and CACL. The second day of the meeting covered remote simultaneous interpreting, with a chance to try out and compare six remote interpreting platforms.

Getting serious about remote interpreting

The advances in remote simultaneous interpreting (RSI) technology are the biggest technological changes for the interpreting profession since the development of simultaneous interpreting equipment. There has been increasing concern about how professional interpreters can adapt to these changes while maintaining high standards, and AIIC has responded with a series of seminars and discussions, most recently in the Netherlands and at the PRIMS Interregional Meeting. Draft UN agreement approved

After prolonged negotiations by the Negotiating Delegation (ND), the draft Agreement between the United Nations System Chief Executives Board for Coordination (UNCEB) and AIIC was adopted by an overwhelming majority at the World Sectoral meeting on 15 December 2018. The AIIC-UNCEB Agreement was subsequently approved by ExCo on 24 December and signed by the UN on 16 January 2019. The full ratification cycle by all organisations may take some time, although sub-sectors are reporting that their respective organisations are already applying the new terms and rates.

The next World Sectoral meeting will be convened soon, possibly on 4 May 2019, to operationalize the new provisions in the Agreement, to elect a new ND with an updated mandate, and to review the World Sectoral rules of procedure.

AIIC Brazil rewards top technicians

Regional initiative: AIIC Brazil's "Technician of the Year Award" provides an incentive to improve the partnership between technicians and interpreters. Working with the local Professional Association of Conference Interpreters (APIC), AIIC Brazil has prepared an online form and now invites all members to assess the technicians and the equipment available at the venue.

A team of volunteers collects all the assessments and a statistician calculates the result, ranking the best-rated four technicians in Rio and Sao Paulo,



Brazil's largest markets. The winners and their families are then invited to an end-of-year celebration to receive a cash prize and certificate. Moreover, some local equipment providers support the initiative by pledging to match the cash prize for their technicians ranked in the top four.



The Executive Committee (ExCo) met in Geneva on 11-13 January. Their agenda covered remote interpreting, developments in agreement sectors, IT transition plans, and a communication strategy. The meeting included a joint session with the Advisory Board Steering Committee on 11 January to take stock of the past year and plan for 2019.


The Committee on Admissions and Language Classifications (CACL) met on 9-10 January to review new applications.


A tribute to colleagues past


